

VITAL INFORMATION AT DEATH

Required by the funeral home to register your death with the Department of Vital Statistics...

Your surname and all given names

Address of your usual residence

Health card number

Social insurance number

Marital status

If married, widowed or divorced, what is full name of husband or full maiden name of wife

Kind of work you did most of your working life

Kind of business or industry in which you worked

Your birth date

Your birth place – City, town or other place; Province

Your father – surname and given names

Your father's birthplace- City or place; Province or country

Your mother – maiden name and given names

Your mother's birthplace -City or place; Province or country

Required on the application for the Canada Pension Plan Death Benefit...

Most of this form requires basic information that your family would have. Here are the questions they might not easily answer.

7. Did the deceased ever live or work in another country? If yes, indicate the names of the countries and insurance numbers. Also indicate whether a benefit has been requested.

8. Did the deceased ever receive or apply for a benefit under the Canada Pension Plan? Old Age Security? Québec Pension plan? If yes, provide the social insurance number or account number.

9. Was the deceased or the deceased's spouse eligible to receive Family Allowances or was the deceased, the deceased's spouse or the common-law partner eligible to receive the Child Tax Benefit for any children born after December 31, 1958?

Deceased spouse or common-law partner? yes or no
